Do I need a power adapter in Bosnia & Herzegovina?

However, if your devices use a different plug type or are not compatible with the voltage in Bosnia & Herzegovina, you will need a power adapter and/or a voltage converter/transformer. The standard voltage in Bosnia & Herzegovina is 230 V, and the standard frequency is 50 Hz.

Plugs for Bosnia & Herzegovina are: Type C: also known as the Europlug, is a two-pin plug commonly used in most European countries, as well as in parts of Asia and Africa. It features two round pins measuring 4mm in diameter, with a distance of 19mm between them.
